Orange County Sanitation District Celebrating New Headquarters

Ribbon Cutting: Wednesday May 22

What: OC San's newly built 109,000-square foot Headquarters. The new building will centralize over 300 employees currently spread across the vast 100-acre Fountain Valley Plant. The three-story building boasts eco-friendly features like using treated water for heating and achieving net-zero energy. The award-winning design incorporates sustainable materials and will officially open in June 2024.

Why: The event provides an opportunity to formally introduce the new headquarters. The event will feature the OC San Board Chairman Chad Wanke, Fountain Valley Mayor and OC San Board Member Glenn Grandis, and OC San Vice-Chair Ryan Gallagher.

OC San is a public agency that provides wastewater collection, treatment, and recycling for approximately 2.6 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OC San is a special district that is governed by a 25-member Board of Directors composed of 20 cities, four special districts, and one representative from the Orange County Board of Supervisors.
