

Costa Mesa Regional Sewer Projects

Airway Airport Loop Sewer Rehab



As the regional wastewater service provider, the Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) is committed to monitoring and evaluating its infrastructure regularly to ensure top performance and optimal levels of service and operations. There are two upcoming OC San sewer projects in the City of Costa Mesa, including the **Airway Airport Loop Sewer Rehab**, as shown on the map in blue.

The project includes rehabilitation of two parallel regional sewer pipelines along a one-mile stretch on Airway Avenue and Airport Loop Drive in the City of Costa Mesa, near the John Wayne Airport.

Project elements also include improvements at the Main Street Pump Station (near Red Hill Avenue and Main Street) to replace valves and piping, as well as exterior valve vaults.

The regional sewer pipelines and pump station valves have heavy corrosion and will be rehabilitated to extend its useful life for another 25-30 years.

Project Schedule

November 2023 - Summer 2025

Work Hours: Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.
Future work activities require night or weekend work and will be provided in updates when schedules are confirmed.

Dates and times are subject to change due to operational factors or inclement weather.

Impacts: To make room for construction work areas, the travel lanes will be reconfigured, impacting street parking.
